# Let Go, Let God

## Joanne's Perspective

Charles Fillmore once wrote, "Lent embodies an exalted idea, the idea of cleansing and disciplining both mind and body toward the end of making them more receptive to the Christ idea." As we enter the season of Lent, I am in the question myself of, "Where do I resist the Christ Idea for my life?"

The first resistance to arise is in the acceptance that I Am the Christ expressing individually as me. Growing up in traditional Christianity, I was never taught that the potential that Jesus expressed is the same potential that I can express. The thought, "Who do you think you are?" circles round in my head. The feeling of not being good enough or

deserving enough arises with that thought. Taking a breath, I choose a different focus. I choose to remember the Truth. I let go and let God show me how to be in the full possibility of my life.

The second resistance to arise is the fear that I can't accomplish this. I may get it intellectually that I am a unique, individualized expression of God, but to actually put that knowledge into action and expression is a whole other matter! Taking a breath, I choose to remember that I am One with God. I let go and let God show me that all that I need to meet this moment with focus, clarity, ease and grace is fully present right here and now.

The third resistance to arise is my fear

that I can't control the outcome. In fact, I can't control much of anything outside of myself. That kind of control is an illusion. Again, I take a breath and remember the Truth, "I can trust that in this moment, in every moment, God is there and where God is, good is." I let go and let God reveal the good present in every moment no matter what the appearance is in the outer.

Let go, let God.

Over and over again I make this choice. As I get myself out of the way, with all my selfish motives and habits, I discover the perfect Christ idea for each moment in my life! We'll explore this more during Lent. Come join us March 13 and receive your free Lenten booklet!

# The Lord's Prayer Rephrased

A Report from the Core Vision Team

Some time ago I asked people at one of our Sunday services whether they believed in a third person God. No one said they did. So using a segment of the service to talk to, even beg from, a third person God seemed to make no sense to me. From that point, I used some of my spiritual focus on how that segment could be brought into harmony with my understanding of the Unity concepts of personal responsibility to become a conscious part of the Creative Source. Here is my effort to give us a prayer which affirms our connection to a Universal Source while also reassuring us we can take responsibility for our own actions.

## **Holy Creator, we praise your Names**

This revision asks us to recognize that people use different names for the same concept of an original Source of all things.

## **Our wills in Heaven and Earth the same**

We work to bring our physical selves into

harmony with the Mind of the Creator. Therefore, we seek to bring our daily, earth selves into alignment with our heavenly, or spiritual selves. The previous version stated that God's will was the same on earth and in heaven. Well, yes, but what does that do other than state the obvious.

## **Our needs are met Lord, through us this day**

Do people using the Unity practices wait for God to do for them, or do they act as God's hands, feet, eyes, etc. When we recognize our participation in accepting and then using the unlimited power of the Creator for every aspect of our daily lives, we leave the mindset of supplicants behind and embrace unlimited possibilities for our own actions.

## **Let our forgiveness light our ways**

When we forgive, we release our thoughts and emotions from the bondage of attachment. Gautama, who became a Buddha, said attachment to thoughts and

emotions was the foundation of all problems on the path to enlightenment. Neither Jesus nor Gautama denied emotions, they just led them to be led by their spirits and thoughts. In this way, emotions are as pure as the connection to spirit can make them.. We do not need to ask for God's forgiveness. When we become aware of an action or concept which is not based on the alignment of harmony with the Universal Oneness, we understand the possibility for change. Sometimes we awaken to our shortcomings without awakening to the concept of a non-grudge holding Universe. Forgiveness implies an awareness of the difference between what we do or how we see ourselves and a more optimal self. We need to forgive our own actions that are not connected to a pure spirit, and then forgive, or become unattached, to the actions of others when we feel, see or believe those actions to be hurtful or limiting.

## **We move away from temptations hold**

I have yet to meet a perfectly perfected person in the flesh. I know I have temptations, among them the desire to present my views so others could see ways other than their own to understand the Creation. By saying we can move from things or situations that divert us from an optimal path we do several things: First, we acknowledge a condition within ourselves that we now find limiting. Second, we are given an opportunity to practice the previous line and forgive ourselves for things we did which we did not previously recognize as diversionary. Third, we give ourselves permission to change at a pace we can accept. For some, this is instantaneous; others use more deliberate, measured processes.

## **We find our way, Lord, in great accord**

If we truly believe we are part of the universal source, we have never left God's presence. Instead we continue seeking harmony or understanding with that which is there to understand and be. Each

step any of us takes to be a more active part of the Creator brings benefit to all Creation. And though at any point in time we believe we have reached a "best possible", we must leave the door open to new revelations. The great accord is a way to explain being in perfect harmony with the Creative Source.

## **For all the wisdom, power and praise**

Changing the word Kingdom to wisdom shows several things. In the teachings of Israel and Judea is told the story of the replacing of the Council of Judges with a Kingdom, because the people of the 12 tribes wanted to be more like their neighbors. Is that what, a Ruler who dispenses Justice and demands Loyalty on pain of death I think not. Rather we acknowledge three aspects of the limitless scope of the Original Source.

## **Begins in you and now displays**

Earlier in the service we affirm God as the only power in our lives. Wisdom is the synthesis of comprehension among the spiritual, rational and emotional aspects of

self, and is in harmony with the Creative, Original Source. Power is the strength to act from Wisdom. Praise is the integrity to act powerfully, with wisdom, and glorify the understanding. We can close our prayer by acknowledging that now we can act from this perspective. It is not a remote, future possibility.

Four times in this rewrite I have used a second or third person word for the Original Source: Creator, Lord and You. These words can refer to an outside entity, or they can refer to the aspects of our selves, such as our spirit or soul, that we reach towards when our everyday selves are found wanting. I see the original self, as did Charles Fillmore, as a pure emanation of the Original Source. I see this emanation as the champion, the mother, the guide of my earthly efforts. When I connect with that pure, original emanation, I am reminded of what I can be. This is what is, what can be, and what awaits us when we choose to be: A pure connection to All That Is; visible as self and yet in harmony with Perfection.

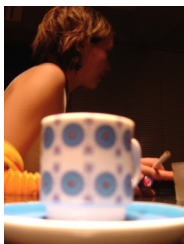
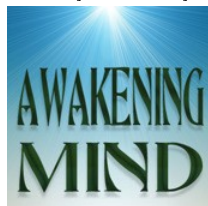

# Heartfelt Thanks To Rev. Joanne



Our pastor, Rev. Joanne, usually selects a HeartFelt Thanks honoree from among members of the congregation. It is the church's way of recognizing the service all of our members provide – services that keep the activities (spiritual, business, and social) running smoothly in our church.

We hold all of those honored in the past years in a special place. This month, we want to honor Rev. Joanne – for all she has done for our church and done for all of us. Joanne accepts challenges as opportunities to live Unity principles and re-affirm her belief in God's vision for herself, our church, and for all of us.

We are lucky to have her as our minister and teacher, and we want to honor her with a HeartFelt Thanks this month.

**How long have you been affiliated with Unity and also Unity In Edinboro, first as a student of Unity teachings, as a member of Unity In Edinboro, and as our church teacher/leader and, as of this summer, our minister?**

My family and I began attending Unity In Edinboro in 1997. I served three years on the board as treasurer and began

attending Personal Development classes at Unity Village. With the encouragement of a majority of the congregation, I took on the role of Spiritual Leader in September 2001.

**What first brought you to Unity; why did you find you liked about its teachings?**

Gary and I were looking for a spiritual community for our family, which included two daughters who were 7 and 10 years old at the time. I had been studying metaphysics for a number of years, as well as writing articles on occasion for a metaphysical newspaper. I had seen advertisements in that newspaper for Unity, and trusted it would be a good fit. As it turned out, it was a good fit! I like the practical aspect of Unity. I like how you can apply the teachings and see things transforming in your life. I like the metaphysical approach Unity teaches of the bible. In Unity, I have discovered a fresh perspective that honors the Christ Spirit – a perspective that does not elevate Jesus, his life, and his teachings, but encourages us all to BE the Christ expressing.

**What first brought you to Unity In Edinboro; what did you find you liked**

**about our church?**

At the time we decided to attend a Unity church, we could have driven 45 miles in almost any direction and discovered a Unity church. We chose Edinboro first and Gary discovered drag racers there. That sealed the deal for him! I loved the warm acceptance we experienced. I loved that when I asked if there was a Sunday school for the girls, Virginia Howells positively responded, "No, but there could be!" I loved the friends we made there. I loved the creativity and openness. As so many have said, "It felt like home."

**What convinced you to seek further training to become an ordained Unity minister?**

I love all things spiritual. I have shared before that Gary considers me a "God nerd." It seemed natural to me to attend classes at Unity Village. At the time, I had also spoken on occasion at Unity In Edinboro when the Rev. John Brown was unavailable. When he stepped down as Spiritual Leader, I was one of about six individuals who rotated and shared the Sunday message. Individuals within the congregation began to encourage me to consider becoming the Spiritual Leader. During my first visit to Unity Village, my prayer was:

“God show me if this is mine to do.” I got clarity during this visit that being the Spiritual Leader of Unity In Edinboro was mine to do. When I first got home, I ignored that clarity. After a week of “depression,” Gary asked what was wrong. I shared with him the clarity I had received at Unity Village; he encouraged me to follow through. When I finally made the decision in my mind, the depression lifted. From the beginning, my intention was to follow through the whole process by becoming an ordained Unity Minister through the Field Licensing Program. I have grown and stretched in ways I could never have imagined when I began this process. What a joy to fulfill that intention this past summer with my friends and family at Unity In Edinboro.

**What are your goals for the next 12 months?**

At Unity In Edinboro, I have been working with the Core Vision Council to get clarity of how to create the Sacred Space of Possibility within our community. I have been asking how we can create a Spiritual Community that is more than a “Sunday Service Church.” We have been in the question of how we can support and encourage one another to take these practical spiritual principles and put them into action within the community as well as

within our own individual lives. Unity teachings are powerful and transformative as they are put into practice. As we learn to do so in spiritual community, it becomes easier to do so with others in our lives. I am also clear that this is not my community, but *our* community. We are creating it together. Therefore, we continue to look for ways to allow the many diverse voices of community an opportunity to express.

**If you had to use one word to describe our church (and its membership), what would that word be – and why?**

Individuality. Our church recognizes and honors the unique individuality of each one. That means that we don’t always agree with one another. That means that sometimes our buttons are pushed and we are stretched because each one is allowed to express in their own unique and individual way. And yet what a relief to know that each one is allowed to be themselves. It has also been a tremendous growing opportunity for me to discover how to allow each one to show up uniquely, individually, knowing that this is at the very heart of the Unity teachings.

**Tell us about yourself outside of church: your family, hobbies and interests. And please tell**

**us: your favorite flower, ice cream flavor, TV show, and what’s playing on your iPod right now.**

I’m laughing at the thought of myself outside of church. Church is such a huge part of my life.

However, I am also an accountant for a large financial advisory firm in Michigan. I have a huge flower garden that I created before I took on all of this, and I sometimes wonder at my sanity to keep it going. My favorite flower continues to be a deep purple lilac; I love when the air is thick with lilac smell in the spring. Anything chocolate, including ice cream, is my favorite flavor. I like to watch HGTV and movies, but I rarely have a show that I watch from week to week. And on my iPod are a few good uplifting songs from Agape and Daniel Nahmod, transformative sound bites from the Rev. Johnnie Coleman on forgiveness, and a whole bunch of hour-long conversations with the Spiritual Leaders of our world, including Andrew Harvey, Bishop Spong, Matthew Fox, and the Rev. James Trapp. What can I say, but this is truly a reflection of a “God Nerd’s iPod.”
